From The Mayor

The water project should be wrapping up by the time you read this. A new water main and new water connections were installed in the area of State Street and South Ave. This work should remedy the problematic water main issues in this area by replacing 90-year-old piping. This project was paid for with ARPA money and water reserves.

The Village has been designated a Clean Energy Community by NYSERDA. We earned this designation by performing 4 tasks: LED street light conversion, CEO Training, adoption of unified solar permit, and benchmarking of municipal energy use. The village has been awarded a \$5,000 grant by NYSERDA to use for energy improvements at our new office.

Lions Club Veterans Banners

The Lions club will have 25 poles to display their doublesided tribute banners for our Veterans. The first 50 honorees were selected from the information provided by the East Bloomfield Historical Society. The proposed plan is to have the banners displayed from Memorial Day through Veterans Day. The delivery of the current banners was received 2 days prior to Memorial Day Weekend. The Village crew were already working on prescheduled projects and hung up as many banners as they could in the short time frame. Installation of the banners requires new brackets to be put on the poles before attaching the banners. This is a multiyear program which will cost approximately \$6,000 per year. Rabies Clinics

Because we have documented rabies in our county. New York State Law requires every dog, cat, and ferret at least 3 months of age be vaccinated against rabies at all times. Each year Ontario County Public Health provides six free rabies clinics throughout the county. The 2023 rabies clinics run from 9AM-Noon and are scheduled for the following dates and: August 5th, September 16th, and October 28th. All clinics will be held at the Ontario County Public Works at 2962 County Road 48 in Canandaigua. Clinics are FREE but donations are appreciated. Dogs, Cats and ferrets must be healthy and at least 12 weeks old. Bring your most recent rabies certificate with you if possible. Pets must be on a leash or in a carrier. EBHS Car and Motorcycle Show and Parade



How Our Drainage System Works in the Village

In the Village of Bloomfield there are two systems of drainage: the sanitary sewer system and the storm drainage system.

Sanitary Sewer: The sanitary sewer system takes household wastewater (such as water waste from sinks, toilets, washers,etc.) and carries it through a home's plumbing and into an underground sewer pipe. From there it ultimately goes to the Village's wastewater treatment plant, where the wastewater is treated. In an effort to avoid sewer clogs, follow the FOG rule. Fats, Oils, and Grease (FOG) may clog your pipes and cause a sanitary sewer backup. FOG solidifies when cooled and gets lodged in pipes. Here are some other most common items that can clog the pipes are feminine products, excess toilet paper, face and baby wipes, paper towels, egg shells, rice or pasta, and grease are just a few examples.

Storm Drainage System: On the other hand, and as seen in the graphic below, the storm drainage system carries discharge from streets and routes it into curbside catch basins. From there, it also enters another underground, but separate, system. The storm drainage system discharges directly into streams without treatment.



A storm sewer drain is designed to drain excess water from paved streets, parking lots, and sidewalks. Storm drains vary in design from small dry wells, to ditches, to large piped municipal systems.
