From The Mayor

Work is progressing on getting our new office ready. even though it is slower than we would like. Discovering asbestos and having it abated created some delays, but we are moving forward. Thanks to a grant from NYSERDA, all the lighting in the building has been upgraded to LED. Security cameras, internet, and flooring installs are scheduled. Village DPW employees will be working on floor joist replacement and partition wall build. Interior painting is also scheduled. A lot to do That being said, we have determined for sure. November 6th, 2023 as our target move in date. All Village office functions will be moving to 46 Main Street at that time. Hopefully, luck is on our side, and we will be in the new building soon!

Village Tax Bills

Reminder that any Village taxes not paid by November 1st will be rolled over to the County for collection on your January County tax bill. Payments can be made by mail, with a credit card on our website, or in person at the Village Office, 12 Main St. PO Box 459 **Please do not pay at the Town Hall.** All questions regarding addresses, including changes to tax bills for those owners residing out of the area, are handled by the Town Assessor's Office, 657-7700.

Brush Pickup

The scheduled **brush pickup is the week of October 9th**. Please have your brush by the curb with branches parallel to the road but not in the road or in the gutters. You may bring your brush to the WWTP Monday through Thursday from 8 am until 3:30 pm. We are not able to take leaves. Please do not rake leaves into the gutters or into the street and please keep the gutters and the street free of grass clippings, as they clog the drainage system.

Halloween

The Board of Trustees determined the time for Halloween Trick or Treating within the Village. It will be from 5-8 PM on Tuesday, October 31st. Please only go to houses that have a porch light on. Be sure to stop into the Fire Department for some refreshments while you are out!



Rabies Clinics

Because we have documented rabies in our county. New York State Law requires every dog, cat, and ferret at least 3 months of age be vaccinated against rabies at all times. Each year Ontario County Public Health provides six free rabies clinics throughout the county. The 2023 rabies clinics run from 9AM-Noon and are scheduled for the following dates and: October 28th. All clinics will be held at the Ontario County Public Works at 2962 County Road 48 in Canandaigua. Clinics are FREE but donations are appreciated. Dogs, Cats and ferrets must be healthy and at least 12 weeks old. Bring your most recent rabies certificate with you if possible. Pets must be on a leash or in a carrier. Water Facts

- A leaky faucet can waste 100 gallons a day
- An average bath requires 37 gallons of water.
- One flush of the toilet uses 3 ½ gallons of water (on average)
- An average family of four uses 881 gallons of water per week just by flushing the toilet.
- The average 5-minute shower takes 15-25 gallons of water--around 40 gallons are used in 10 minutes.
- You use about 5 gallons of water if you leave the water running while brushing your teeth.

Ways to Lower Water Usage

- Check your toilets for leaks.
- Take shorter showers.
- Install water-saving shower heads or flow restrictors.
- Turn off the water while shaving or brushing your teeth.
- Check faucets and pipes for leaks.
- Use the dishwasher or washing machine for full loads only.
- Update dishwashers and washing machines to low water usage appliances.
